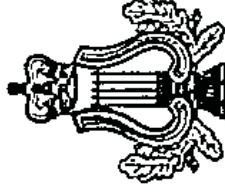

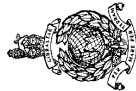

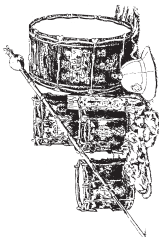

## Donations from the proceeds of this year's All Stars Band Concerts

The band's first concert was in 1990, the aim being to raise money for the disaster fund set up after the bombing of the RM Barracks in Deal the previous September. Since that time the band has performed annually with all proceeds being donated to charities.

The major charity still remains the Royal Marines Band Benevolent Fund which receives £4,000 this year. The Deal Memorial Bandstand Trust is also granted its annual donation of £2,000.

We ask for donations primarily from members of the band but suggestions from other charities are always considered.

In addition to the above, this year the following sums of money have been awarded:

Last year we allocated £500 to provide a bench in the Garden of Rest in Deal. In all likelihood the bench will be placed near the bandstand when permissions have been granted.

We sincerely trust you approve of this use of your money and we thank you for attending these concerts which enables us to be able to make such wonderful donations. This brings the total donated to £136,128.50, £68,000 of this going to the Royal Marines Band Benevolent Fund.

The money we have available comes not only from ticket sales but from the programme sales. In addition we gratefully acknowledge donations from Mr Frape, Mr Westley, Mr Semple, Mr Howse and others too late to be included in this programme including those that do not cash their refund cheques when they have been unable to obtain tickets at a higher price.

tomorrow just you wait and see.

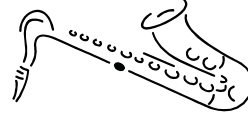


## There'll Always Be An England

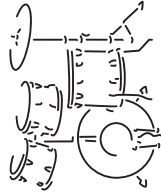
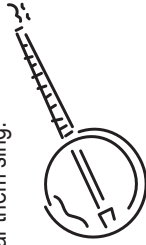
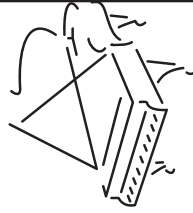
