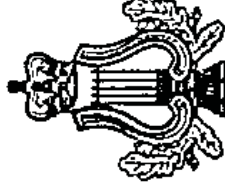

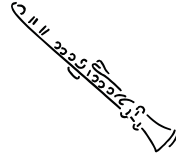

The band's first concert was in 1990, the aim being to raise money for the disaster fund set up after the bombing of the RM Barracks in Deal the previous September. Since that time the band has performed annually with all proceeds being donated to charities.

We are honoured that tonight Captain Andy Gregory of the Royal Marines, Portsmouth will be present to receive a cheque on behalf of the Royal Marines Band Benevolent Fund, our major charity, which receives £2,500 this year. The Deal Memorial Bandstand Trust receives £1,000 which will be received by the mayor of Deal, Cllr Bill Gardner the bandstand President.

Jo Burn - Broadcast Journalist

Jo Burn has lived in East Kent for more than twenty five years and has long been associated with the Royal Marines and the School of Music.

During her time as a presenter for BBC Radio Kent she hosted specialist programmes featuring band music and when the barracks in Walmer closed in 1996, she commented live on air in the pouring rain from a roof top in South Barracks as the Massed Bands marched out through the Jubilee Gates for the very last time.

On a much sunnier day last summer she was invited to help host the 20th Anniversary Concert on the Memorial Bandstand at Walmer Green and tonight she joins us to narrate The Battle of Trafalgar, joining the All Stars for the first time on the stage at the Winter Gardens.

Kenji Kawashima – Guest Conductor

Kenji's introduction to military music came whilst at high school in Tokyo when he first listened to an LP by the Royal Marines Band. He was so struck by the sound that he applied to the Principal Director of Music, Lt Col Vivian Dunn, to join them. He was politely informed that he must be British to join the British armed forces!

His answer to this was to form his own band in Tokyo, the Rikutokai Ensemble, in 1967 which he has conducted ever since. The ensemble is a 50 strong standard British-style military band playing music that one would expect to hear from a Royal Marines Band.

Kenji is a self-taught musician studying music theory, harmony, composition, baton technique, etc in his spare time whilst working for an American high-technology company. He has become an expert on military music and Royal Marines Bands in particular and has translated award winning biographies of Sousa and Alford into Japanese whilst being a member of the International Military Music Society and the Japan Sousa Society.

This is not Kenji's first visit to the Winter Gardens because he realised his dream to conduct a Royal Marines Band on this very stage in 2001 courtesy of Cinque Port Music. His knowledge of Royal Marines Bands is so great that he informed the musicians that he was standing on the same stage that Kenneth Alford himself stood with his band some 66 years before. Not a lot of people know that!

We know he will receive a warm welcome from the band and trust he will get a similar reception from the audience.



DAVID COLE MVO MMUS ARAM RM

David Cole received his early musical training with the Salvation Army and playing in the London Schools Symphony Orchestra on tuba. He joined the Royal Marines Band Service in 1967 from which he retired as a Director of Music after 32 years service. David studied conducting at the Royal Academy of Music and was awarded the Silver Medal of the Worshipful Company of Musicians. His career in the Royal Marines culminated in September 1992



when he was appointed Director of Music to the Band of HM Royal Marines Portsmouth and Her Majesty's Yacht Britannia. An appointment he held to December 1997 when the Royal Yacht was decommissioned in Portsmouth. The Queen honoured him by awarding him membership of the Royal Victorian Order (MVO).

Following his long and distinguished career in the Royal Marines he spent the next few years in teaching as the Head of Music at Wellesley House, a top Independent Preparatory School in Broadstairs, Kent where he also continued his life-long love of sport and athletics.

David was appointed Director of Music to the Royal British Legion in 2006. He is also the Assistant Producer of the annual Festival of Remembrance, a major national event broadcast on BBC television and radio. David's wide experience as a musical director ranges from symphony and concert orchestras, wind and brass bands, to choral conducting, big bands and dance bands.

David took the appointment of Director of Music of the All Stars Band upon the retirement of Paul Neville in 2008.
