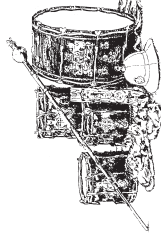
**Sunday 8th June**

## **Donations from the proceeds of this year's All Stars Band Concert**

The band's first concert was in 1990, the aim being to raise money for the disaster fund set up after the bombing of the RM Barracks in Deal the previous September. Since that time the band has performed annually with all proceeds being donated to charities.

The major charity still remains the Royal Marines Band Benevolent Fund which receives £4,000 this year. The Deal Memorial Bandstand Trust is also granted its annual donation of £2,000.

We ask for suggestions primarily from members of the band but suggestions from other charities are always considered.

In addition to the above, this year the following have been awarded sums of money:

In addition to this, we have allocated £1000 to buy a bench which will be erected near the Deal Memorial Bandstand.

When all the bills have been paid there may be further sums that can be donated; the fund retains only a small amount of money to finance the next concert.

We sincerely trust you approve of this use of your money and we thank you for attending these concerts which enables us to be able to make such wonderful donations. This brings the total donated to over £150,000; £76,000 of this going to the Royal Marines Band Benevolent Fund.

The money we have available comes not only from ticket sales but from the programme sales. In addition we gratefully acknowledge donations from Barry Shucksmith, Wally Spencer, Peter Squires and others too late to be included in this programme including those that do not cash their refund cheques when they have been unable to obtain tickets at a higher price.

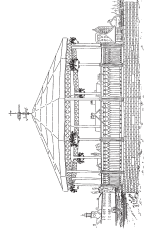

## **DAVID COLE** MVO MMUS ARAM RM

David Cole received his early musical training with the Salvation Army and playing in the London Schools Symphony Orchestra on tuba. He joined the Royal Marines Band Service in 1967 from which he retired as a Director of Music after 32 years service. David studied conducting at the Royal Academy of Music and was awarded the Silver Medal of the Worshipful Company of Musicians. His career in the Royal Marines culminated in September 1992



when he was appointed Director of Music to the Band of HM Royal Marines Portsmouth and Her Majesty's Yacht Britannia. An appointment he held to December 1997 when the Royal Yacht was decommissioned in Portsmouth. The Queen honoured him by awarding him membership of the Royal Victorian Order (MVO).

Following his long and distinguished career in the Royal Marines he spent the next few years in teaching as the Head of Music at Wellesley House, a top Independent Preparatory School in Broadstairs, Kent where he also continued his life-long love of sport and athletics.

For the past three years David has been the Chairman of the Deal Memorial Bandstand Trust which presents concerts on Walmer Green every Sunday from May to September.

David was appointed Director of Music to the Royal British Legion in 2006. He is also the Assistant Producer of the annual Festival of Remembrance, a major national event broadcast on BBC television and radio. David's wide experience as a musical director ranges from symphony and concert orchestras, wind and brass bands, to choral conducting, big bands and dance bands.

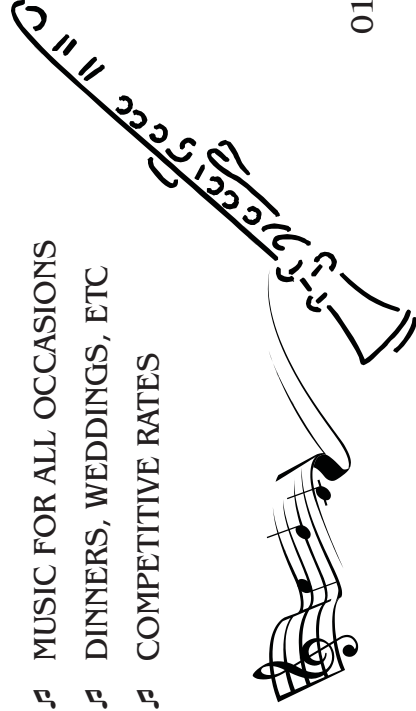
