The Village is generally a quiet place with friendly people. Unlike on the coast there is only a small scattered English community. There are a number of small bars that still supply Tapas with drinks at no extra cost. The drinks are cheap too! Meals in the bars are simple Spanish cuisine. Jamon (cured Ham), Chicken, Pork and Rabbit are the most common meat dishes.

There are a number of small supermarkets. A couple of banks. A few shops and a pharmacy. A small market is held on a Saturday morning. This whole area of Spain still observes the 'Siesta' so everything closes and little work is done during the early afternoon. Shops open again at about 5pm till about 9pm.

HOW TO BOOK

1. Check flight availability for dates you require (see airport info in last Newsletter) then telephone or email us to check availability of accommodation.
2. Ring or email us to provisionally book the dates you require. (Your full name, postal address and telephone number must be supplied.)
3. We will inform you of the required deposit and supply you with bank details and a reference number under which to pay it. We will hold your provisional booking for a stated period to allow you time to pay in the required deposit.
4. On receipt of your deposit will we confirm your booking.
5. Balance of payment (less deposit) is payable in cash on arrival including a 200€ refundable breakages deposit.

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
